PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005 INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) under section 16 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* (the PD Act) may, by resolution, delegate any function of the WAPC to a member, committee or officer of the WAPC, or to a public authority or a member or officer of a public authority.

In accordance with section 16(4) of the PD Act, a reference in this instrument to a function of the WAPC includes and extends to, without limitation or restriction, any of the powers, privileges, authorities, discretions, duties and responsibilities vested in or conferred upon the WAPC by the Act or any other written law as the case requires.

Resolution under section 16 of the PD Act (Delegation)

On 23 July 2025, pursuant to section 16 of the PD Act, the WAPC resolved—

- A. To DELEGATE its powers and functions as set out in column 1 of the schedule below, to the Chairperson of the WAPC, the Deputy Chairperson of the WAPC and the person or persons from time to time holding or acting in the offices in the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage as outlined in column 2 of the schedule, subject to any conditions specified in column 3 of the schedule.
- B. That this resolution take effect from 8 August 2025.

The delegation was amended by resolution of the WAPC on 20 AUGUST 2025 and 22 APRIL 2026.

SCHEDULE

Interpretation and general guidance
