

**PL403****PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005****AMENDMENT TO INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION—POWERS OF OFFICERS**

Notice of amendment to the Instrument of Delegation 2020/02 Delegation to officers of certain powers and functions of the Western Australian Planning Commission as gazetted on 17 July 2020.

**Preamble**

Under section 16 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* (the Act) the Western Australian Planning Commission (the WAPC) may, by resolution published in the *Government Gazette*, delegate any function to a member, committee or officer of the WAPC or to a public authority or a member or officer of a public authority.

In accordance with section 16(4) of the Act, a reference in this instrument to a function or a power of the WAPC includes and extends to, without limitation or restriction, any of the powers, privileges, authorities, discretions, duties and responsibilities vested in or conferred upon the WAPC by the Act or any other written law as the case requires.

**Resolution under s16 of the Act (delegation)**

On 28 October 2020, pursuant to section 16 of the Act, the WAPC resolved—

- A. To amend the Instrument of Delegation 2020/02 Delegation to officers of certain powers and functions of the Western Australian Planning Commission as gazetted on 17 July 2020, as set out in Schedule 1 below.
